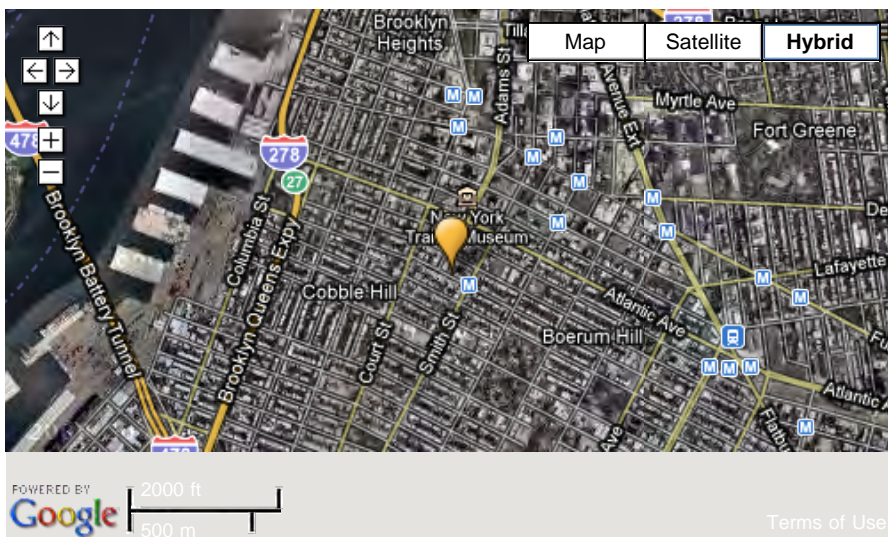

A frenchman and a financial-analyst-turned-gallerist are in the process of transforming a former Invisible Dog factory at 51 Bergen Street in Cobble Hill into an arts center with design studios, a community garden and, more importantly, low rents. The project is a collaboration between Muriel Guepin, who opened the [Shop Art Gallery](#) on the ground floor of the building last December, and Lucian Zayan, who recently moved to Brooklyn from his hometown of Paris.
